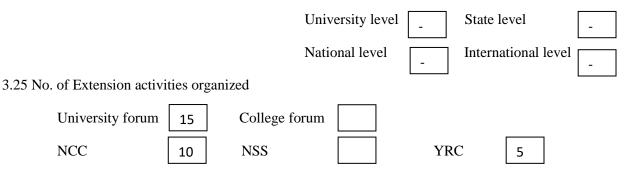

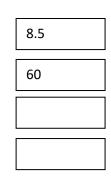



Every semester academically weak students and personally disturbed student's parents will be called to discuss on the student's progress and records maintained in the department for the follow up action.

6.13 Development programmes for support staff

One day session was conducted on the topic move to changes to motivate the support staff and also discussion on various issues faced by them and suggested with ways to overcome for the smooth functioning.
